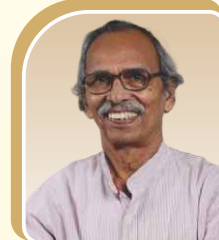

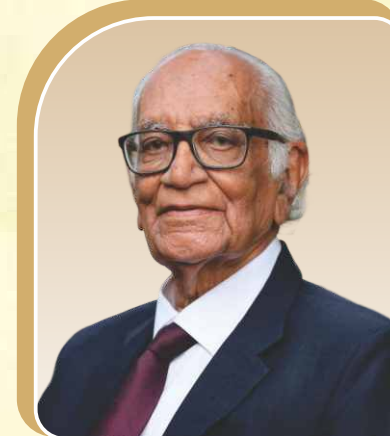

Justice Panachand Jain, fondly remembered as "Kakaji", was a towering personality whose life reflected the highest ideals of justice, humanity, and education. A distinguished jurist, visionary educationist, and compassionate public intellectual, he dedicated himself to the service of constitutional values and society with integrity and humility. As the former Chairperson of the Kanoria Girls' College Trust, his wisdom and guidance deeply influenced generations of students and educators.

Born on 19 March 1927 in Kota, Rajasthan, into a cultured Jain family, Justice Jain inherited strong moral and ethical values from his parents, Shri Moolchand Ji and Smt. Sosar Devi Ji. He pursued his education at Anklank School, Kota, Government College, Kota, and later studied law, choosing the legal profession as his life's mission. Deeply patriotic from an early age, he travelled to Delhi on 15 August 1947 to witness India's Independence and Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru's historic "Tryst with Destiny" speech, an experience that profoundly shaped his democratic vision.

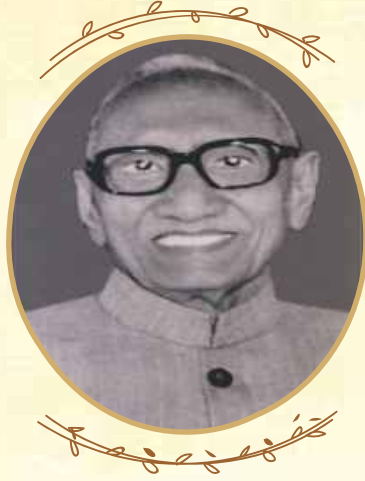
Beginning his legal practice in 1951 under the guidance of his elder brother, Late Shri Nathulal Jain, he soon became known for his sharp intellect, balanced reasoning, and humane outlook. In 1985, he was elevated as Judge of the Rajasthan High Court, where he earned immense respect for his constitutional wisdom and fairness. He was part of the historic Bench that declared the practice of Sati inhuman, marking a significant moment in India's social reform history.

Even after retirement, Justice Jain remained deeply committed to public causes, including human rights, environmental justice, and the welfare of marginalized communities. He served on international tribunals and fact-finding missions concerning Singur, Nandigram, Malaysia, climate justice, and the Narmada Bachao Andolan, besides representing his organization at global climate summits from COP-15 to COP-24. His constitutional insight was also sought during consultations preceding the introduction of the Article 370 legislation. His four-volume work, Indian Democracy: A Constitutional Perspective, remains a valuable contribution to constitutional scholarship.

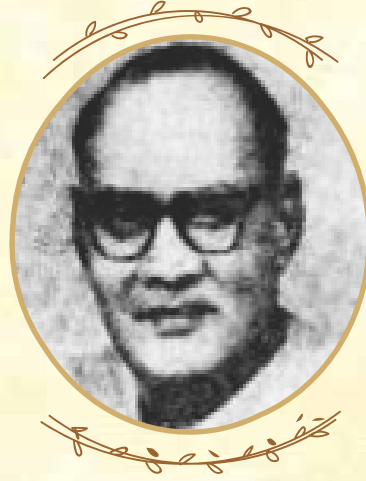
Education remained closest to his heart. As Chairperson and Trustee of institutions including Kanoria PG Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Kanoria School of Law for Women, Vedic Kanya Mahavidyalaya, Maharshi Dayanand Law College, Bhuvnesh Bal Vidyalaya, and Vidhyashram School, he championed value-based education rooted in intellectual excellence, discipline, and social responsibility. He believed education to be a transformative force capable of shaping enlightened individuals and a just society.

Honoured with recognitions such as the Hadouti Ratna and Sahitya Ratna awards, Justice Panachand Jain leaves behind a legacy that transcends law and education. His life continues to inspire countless individuals with its message of wisdom, compassion, humility, and public service. The institution pays its heartfelt tribute to this extraordinary visionary whose memory will forever remain a source of inspiration and pride.

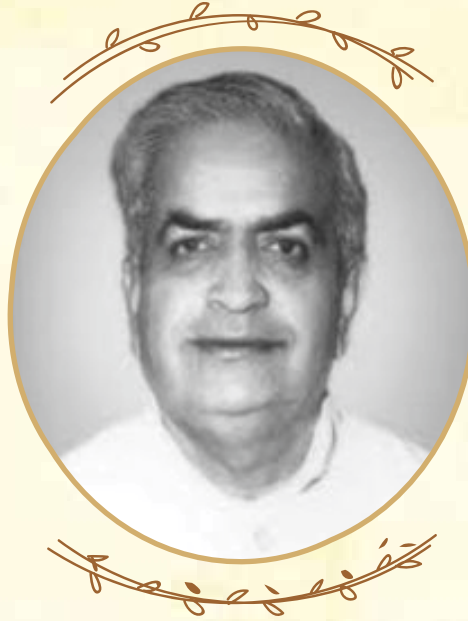

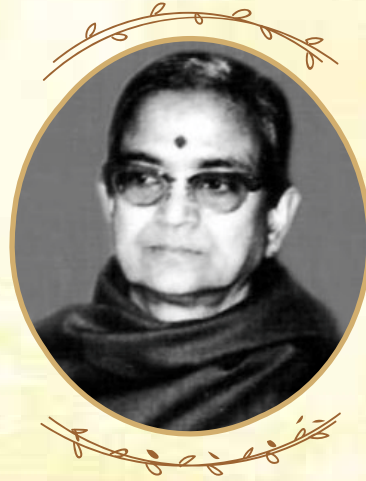

Six Decades of Light: The Living Legacy of Kanoria PG Mahila Mahavidyalaya

What began as a modest initiative six decades ago has today blossomed into Kanoria PG Mahila Mahavidyalaya, one of Rajasthan's most distinguished institutions shaping generations with knowledge, creativity, and values. Established on 19 July 1965 through the visionary efforts of educationists Ms. Krishna Terway and Ms. Hemlata Prabhu, with the generous support of philanthropist Seth Bhagirath Kanoria and Shri B. M. Singhi, the College emerged from a profound commitment to making quality higher education accessible to young women at a time when such opportunities were limited. Beginning modestly within the campus of Poddar School for the Deaf and Dumb, the institution has evolved into a vibrant centre of academic excellence and cultural enrichment. The remarkable journey of the College is reflected in its thriving intellectual and artistic traditions — from staging Mikhail Roshchin's *Evacuation Train* in its formative years to presenting George Bernard Shaw's *Pygmalion* today, symbolizing the institution's expanding horizons in literature, theatre, and critical thought. Today, the sprawling campus, equipped with ICT-enabled classrooms, a rich library, auditorium, sports complex, swimming pool, cafeteria, and hostels, stands as a testament to a sixty-year legacy shaped by vision, perseverance, innovation, and excellence.

Over the years, the College has evolved into a vibrant intellectual and cultural hub through the collective contributions of visionary principals, committed faculty, and generations of dynamic students. Continuously expanding its academic horizons, the institution introduced innovative and interdisciplinary programmes ranging from postgraduate courses and computer education in the late 1980s to contemporary professional programmes in Journalism and Mass Communication, Financial Analysis, Functional English, GIS, Organic Farming, Music and Dance, Information Technology, and many others. National and international seminars, academic conferences, workshops, and public discussions on themes such as higher education, feminism, ethics, environmental sustainability, and public policy cultivated an atmosphere of intellectual inquiry and social awareness. Eminent scholars, writers, artists, jurists, and activists regularly enriched the campus with their presence, inspiring students to think critically and engage meaningfully with the world around them.

Cultural expression has always remained the soul of Kanoria College. From its pioneering theatrical beginnings in the early years to the staging of internationally acclaimed classics decades later, the institution's six-decade journey reflects a vibrant and evolving tradition of dramatic arts and creative expression. Memorable theatre productions, Hindi and English plays, dance dramas, youth festivals, literary gatherings, music and art events, alumni celebrations, and international cultural exchanges have infused campus life with creativity and vibrancy. Prestigious events such as the Annual English Play, Kasturi Youth Festival, CAMFEST, SAGA Literature Fest, Techkshitij, Management Fest, Digital Ideathon, and Kanoria Fiesta continue to provide platforms for artistic excellence, innovation, and leadership. Educational tours across India further broadened students' intellectual and cultural horizons, while the institution's robust sports culture enabled students to excel at national and international levels.

The ethos of the College finds reflection in its distinguished alumni, who have made notable contributions across diverse fields. The illustrious alumnae include Kathak exponent Padma Shri Smt. Prerna Shrimali, Commonwealth Games gold medallist Padma Shri Dr. Krishna Ponia, accomplished administrators such as Dr. Pragya Paliwal, Shivangi and Devangi Swarnkar, Garima Bhatnagar, Sapna Tiwari, and Mamta Kochar, among many others who continue to uphold the institution's legacy of excellence, integrity, and public service.

Beyond academic achievement, the founders envisioned an institution committed to the holistic development and empowerment of women — one that would nurture courage, social responsibility, and leadership. Under the inspiring leadership of Dr. Renuka Pamecha and Dr. Rashmi Chaturvedi, Kanoria emerged as a powerful voice for women's rights and social justice. Faculty members and students actively participated in significant movements and public discourses surrounding the Roop Kanwar case (1987), the Bhanwari Devi movement (1992), the Nirbhaya movement (2012), the RG Kar case (2024), and numerous other struggles advocating dignity, equality, and justice for women. The institution's enduring engagement with social transformation is reflected in its

contribution to landmark developments such as the Vishakha Guidelines (1997), the Right to Information movement in Rajasthan leading to the RTI Act (2001), the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act (2005), and the Criminal Law Amendment Act (2013). Through these interventions, the College established itself not merely as an educational institution, but as a catalyst for progressive social change and democratic participation.

In recent years, under the dynamic leadership of Director Dr. Rashmi Chaturvedi and Principal Dr. Seema Agrawal, the institution has embraced the transformative vision of the National Education Policy 2020 through the establishment of Research Centres, Incubation Centres, Intellectual Property Rights Cells, Institution Innovation Councils, and several initiatives fostering innovation, entrepreneurship, and interdisciplinary learning. Scholarships, inclusive admissions policies, skill-development programmes, and student support centres continue to ensure that education remains accessible, equitable, and empowering for learners from diverse social and economic backgrounds.

What began as a dream six decades ago has today become a luminous institution that nurtures aspirations, awakens intellect, and transforms lives. Kanoria PG Mahila Mahavidyalaya continues to uphold its foundational commitment to shaping women who are intellectually accomplished, socially aware, ethically grounded, and economically empowered — women prepared not only to succeed in their chosen paths, but also to contribute meaningfully to society and the nation.

- **4 Year UG Degree (Honours):** A Four year honours degree in the MAJOR discipline will be awarded to those who complete a four-year Degree with **200 credits.**
- **4 Year UG Degree (Honours with research):** Students who have secured 75% marks and above in first six semesters and wish to undergo research at UG level can choose research stream in the FOURTH year. The students who secure **200 credits** including 12 credits from research project/dissertation will be awarded UG Degree (Honours with Research).

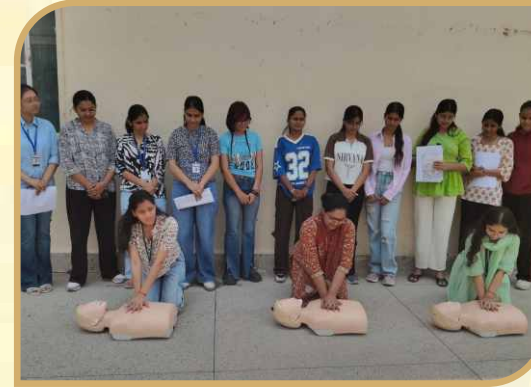

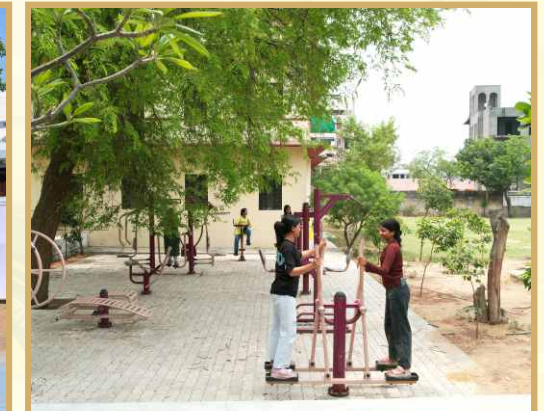

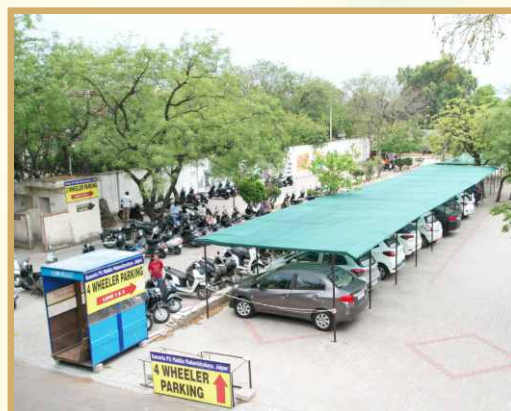

The Library has a rich collection of more than 77,000 books with an excellent reading ambience and scalable infrastructure. The Library offers 14 daily Newspapers (7 in Hindi and 7 in English) and 106 Periodicals (15 International and 55 National Journals and 36 Magazines) and has also 652 Hard Bound Journals. 275 CD's, 26 Maps, 09 Subjective Charts and 2037 Project Reports/Dissertations are also available in the Library. It also consists of a Book-Bank/Gifted Section, Reference Section, Computer Center/Cyber Room, Not-To-Be-Issued Section, along with a separate Section where 5 Years Old Question Papers are available.

- **Library Software (KOHA-ILMS):** KOHA is an open source web based integrated Library system that is used worldwide and executed through a barcode system. Every student and faculty can use it. Login ID - kanoria.bestbookbuddies.com
- **User friendly software:** OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) facilitates direct access to Library catalogue. It makes it convenient for the faculty and students to search for the desired text. It can be accessed both within and outside the college.
- **Sections, Services/Facilities:**
- **Book Lending System (Issue-Return):** Books can be borrowed for 15 days. A penalty system exists for those students who do not abide by the rules of book lending. Students should check the book for any torn or missing pages and seek an endorsement on the book prior to its issue.

- **Reference Room Section:** Total reference books 4250 including 261 Rare Books, 78 written by Faculties. Students/Faculty can refer books of Foreign Authors, Dictionaries, Multi Volume Books, Annual Financial Reports, Economic Survey, Year Books, Biographies, and Maps etc.
- **Not-to-Be-Issued Section:** This Section has 3400 books. It has books on competition, Self-Help, Skill enhancement, Career Counseling etc.
- **Last 5 Years Question Papers:** The Library provides this facility to students to understand the exam pattern and important topics. It also improves their preparation and boosts confidence.
- **Book Bank and Gifted Section:** The College provides books to underprivileged students on an annual basis through a Book-Bank section which contains 10238 books managed by the college Library. Forms are available within the Library itself for students who would like to avail this facility. Apart from this, the Library also maintains a catalogue of 4008 Gifted Books as well.
- **Reprographic Services:**
- (i) **Photocopy:** The Library provides a photocopy facility for the students. They can easily copy important pages from books and notes. The service is available at a low cost.
- (ii) **Print-Out Facility:** The Library provides a printout facility for the students. They can take printout of important documents related to the Admission/Examination. This service is available at a nominal charge.
- **E-Resources:** Library provides access to high quality content which are provided through government initiatives, Open Access repositories and Digital Libraries. SAGE also provides digital access to its resources. Students can use digital resources for their studies.
- **Computer Center/Cyber Room:** It has 30 Computer Systems and 5 Web Cams. Cyber Room provides fast internet and digital facilities. Here students can use computers for study, research and preparing assignments and also access online resources, e-books and education websites easily.

The centre supports start-ups from ideation to execution through initiatives such as Wednesday Mela, which provides a platform for showcasing and selling products, and one-to-one mentoring sessions that offer personalized expert support. By fostering creativity, skill development, and market readiness, NARIKA creates an empowering ecosystem that encourages self-reliance and sustainable entrepreneurial growth.

Demonstrating innovation and a strong commitment to sustainability, four M.Sc. Botany students — Kajal, Khushi, Sakshi, and Srishti — under the mentorship of Dr. Reema Srivastava, Assistant Professor Department of Botany Kanoria College, developed an innovative kitchen waste management unit, KITCOMP. Charclean – A sustainable initiative won First Award in the Ideathon at Xavier's (XIMI) on 15th March 2026, Registered with college under NARIKA. The system is conceptualized around converting grey water into a decentralized water treatment using biomass waste. Aarohi Soral ; Kajal Kumari presented the idea.

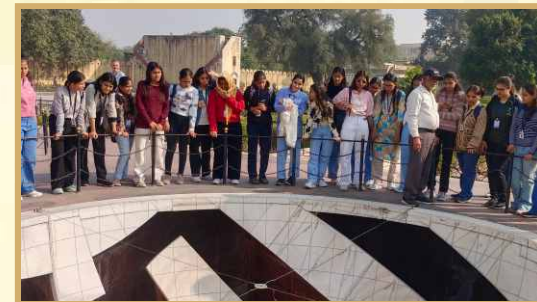

4. लोगों को सामाजिक बुराइयों के प्रति जागरूक करने के लिए 'बेटी बचाओ' तथा 'अंगदान' जैसे विषयों पर परिचर्चा, नुक्कड़ नाटक एवं प्रेरक फिल्म आदि का प्रदर्शन।
5. भारत सरकार के निर्देशानुसार प्रांतीय, राष्ट्रीय तथा अन्तरराष्ट्रीय कार्यक्रमों का आयोजन। प्रांतीय एवं राष्ट्रीय स्तर पर आयोजित कार्यशालाओं, शिविरों तथा युवा सप्ताह में सहभागिता। विद्यार्थियों के प्रारंभिक जीवन से ही उनके व्यक्तित्व को निखारते करते हुए उनमें सेवा भाव, नेतृत्व-क्षमता, संयोजन व प्रबंधन कौशल विकसित करना योजना का उद्देश्य है।
