# DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTANCY & BUSINESS STATISTICS

The session 2021-22 began with the Virtual 'Interactive & Feedback Session' with students of B. Com Part III on 13 August, 2021. Dr. Ranjula Jain, Dean and Associate Professor, Kanoria PG Mahila Mahavidyalaya, along with other experts from the

department, discussed various avenues available for the final year students to choose for their future growth. An analysis was done for the feedback of the students on various optional papers available for them in Undergraduate Final year curriculum. This helped in enhancing their skills for employment opportunities after graduation. Also, alumni students of college shared their experiences as how these papers helped them in getting placed in various recognized positions of good companies. Around thirty students attended this session and benefitted from the expertise of resource persons.



On 28 August, 2021, an extension lecture on 'Dissertation Writing Skills' by Dr. Mrinali Kankar, Assistant Professor, Department of ABST was conducted for the students of PG Semester IV. She discussed in detail the Format, Preface, Introduction, Review of Literature, Research Methodology, Data Analysis and Conclusion and Suggestions chapter to be included in dissertation with the students. Students also asked various questions related to the data collection and Research Methodology. 12 students attended this session and had one to one counselling with the resource person. On 3 September, 2021, a Group Discussion was conducted for the students of B. Com Part II on the topic 'Is Income Tax a liability for an Individual?' The discussion was conducted by Dr. Seema Agrawal, Principal and Head, Department of ABST. Forty students participated in the session and discussed the concept of Income Tax. They were of the view that it is the responsibility of each and every individual who is earning Income under any of the five heads, to pay Income Tax to the government. It is an important revenue for the Government. The discussion was very interesting and knowledgeable for the students.

On 16 October, 2021, an Online session on "GST: One Nation One Tax" was conducted for the UG and PG students. The resource person of the session was Dr. Vandana Bangar, FCA & Ph. D. She elaborately discussed the concept of GST (Goods &

Service Tax), its types, need for this tax in a country like India and its relevance in different sectors of the economy. The session was attended by around two hundred students who not only gained knowledge for the same but also made the session interactive with their queries. For experiential learning of the students of B.Com and M.Com, one-day Industrial Trip was



organised on 25 November, 2021. Fifty-four students with two faculty members Dr. Priyanka Khurana and Dr. Vishnu Priya Temani, visited two Industries; Sakshi International Pvt. Ltd., where students learnt details about Rajasthan's Blue Pottery work and famous Hand-block printing at Sanganer and Salim Kagzi's Paper Industry, where they learnt the process of making handmade paper and how these industries process the raw materials of waste cloth into finished good of beautiful hand-made paper sheets. It was a wonderful experience for the students as they explored methods on how to make these products and also learnt how the costing and pricing is done.

Due to the ongoing pandemic, an 'Online Inter-Collegiate Accounting Talent Search 2021' was organised on 24 December, 2021. Questions related to Accountancy and Business Statistics such as Basic Accounts, Finance, Taxation, Statistics & Auditing were included in the Quiz. More than six hundred and fifty students registered for this Accounting Talent Search from different colleges of different states. The aim of the Accounting Talent Search was to enhance the knowledge of students in the field of Accountancy and Business Statistics.

The department activities always aim to provide market knowledge to its students besides teaching the theoretical aspects of accountancy & business statistics. With this aim and to fulfil the purpose of community outreach, four faculties of the department acted as Resource Person in 'Gyandoot Programme- A State level programme for subject-based online live

classes', jointly organised by Commissionerate of College Education, Jaipur and Govt. Bangur College, Pali. Various webinars, workshops and enrichment programs were regularly attended by the students to enhance their knowledge and skills.

Three students, Subhi Bindal (I prize), Laiba Noor (II prize), and Gargi Gajjar (III prize) were awarded certificates for the best three posters.

A webinar on "Biotechnology and life science job opportunities in India and Abroad" by Mr. Mayank Raj Bhardwaj, Rapture Biotech Group was organised on 1 October, 2021. 44 students actively attended the event.

Training PowerPoint presentations for B.Sc. Biotech II and III year students were organised on 22 - 23 October, 2021 and 3 December, 2021. This activity motivated the students towards research aptitude and developing their interactive skills.

Virtual Lab Activity was organised on 12 November, 2021 for all Biotech students. Head of the Department, Dr. Jyoti Kapil performed a few practicals for the students viz. Casein precipitation, Gel electrophoresis, and Restriction digestion.

An exhibition on "Innovative ideas for waste management" was organised on 15 - 17 November, 2021. Students enthusiastically participated in this activity. They prepared various items with their innovative and creative skills.

An industrial visit to 100 MLD RIICO STP, Taruchaya Nagar was conducted for all biotech students on 27 November, 2021. It is the biggest sewage treatment plant of Jaipur set up as part of the 'Dravyavati river rejuvenation project'. They used activated sludge processes with extended aeration technology for the treatment process. Students were familiarized with various processes of Sewage treatment like Activated sludge processing, coarse screening, fine screening, grit/slit removal system, sedimentation, SBR (sequential batch reactor) treatment technology, BOD, COD, chlorination of decanted water.



On 3 December, 2021, an online interactive session on "Internship opportunities in Biotechnology" by Prof. S.K. Mishra, Senior Coordinator, Learntoupgrade was organised. He emphasized various online internship projects, certificate courses, and skill enhancement courses.

Guest Lecture on "Plant Tissue Culture a perpetual source of Secondary Metabolites" by Dr. Pawan Katariya, HOD, Department of Biotechnology, SMPGC was organised on 22 December, 2021. He enlightened the students with various aspects of plant cell tissue culture approaches for the successful production of plant secondary metabolites, with a special emphasis on the production of valuable compounds having therapeutic properties such as antioxidant, antiviral, antibacterial, and anti-inflammatory.

A vibrant activity, "Biofusion" was organised on 6 January, 2022 for all Biotechnology students. In this event, various activities based on biotechnology like rangoli making, face painting, dumb charades, extempore, quizzes, etc. were

organised by the thirty two students. In the rangoli competition, Payal Prajapat (Pt I), Neha Yadav (Pt II) were awarded I and II prize, respectively and Zeba Ali (Pt I) and Sakshi Koolwal shared III prize, in hand painting Aditi Jhanwar (Pt III), Drishti Samadhiya (Pt III) and Darshna Chouhan (Pt I) grabbed I, II and III positions respectively and in Biotune, Asma Zehra, Anushka Sharma, and Madhvi Choudhary were given prizes.

It was an event that allowed students to showcase their hidden talents. It was a great way to facilitate bonding between students and gave them a chance to get to know each other better. It was a colorful and memorable event.

Student Ms. Venus Sahu (2018-21) received a scholarship for M.Sc. Biotechnology from North-eastern University, Boston.

Overall, the departmental activities enhanced the vision of the students towards the subject and helped them to perceive Biotechnology beyond the routine syllabus.

## DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

The Department conducted multiple activities during the session 2021-22. The beginning of the session was marked by a seven-day Departmental Faculty Development Programme which was conducted from 8 - 15 July, 2021. It was a peer learning activity in which every faculty member participated and exchanged knowledge.

On the first day of FDP, the session was conducted by Dr. Kamakshi Tomar on the topic "Phytochemical Analysis and Extraction". She illustrated various methods of Phytochemical analysis and extraction and also gave a live demonstration of the extraction procedure through the Soxhlet unit. Ms. Yogita Solanki gave a presentation on the second day on the topic "Plant Identification Apps and Artificial Key Preparation". She gave information regarding various plant identification apps like Plant Net, Plant Snap, Leafsnap, Nature ID, Plant lens, etc. On the third day of FDP, Dr. Reema Srivastava presented her topic "Recent Advances in Botany". She focused on recent research of the past 3 to 4 years. Dr. Ritu Jain gave her presentation on Indoor plants on the fourth day of FDP. The



presentation was about the various plants suitable for the indoor environment of the house and their benefits along with how to grow them. The presentation on Environment Impact Assessment was given on the fifth day of FDP by Dr. Neetu Mahawar, Head, Environment Science. The lecture covered the basic outline of Environment Assessment types, Environment Impact Assessment (EIA) and Strategic Environment Assessment (SEA). On the Sixth day of FDP, Dr. Aparna B. Rathore presented her topic "Plant Introduction Procedures". She gave information on the procedures of Plant introduction from one country to another and also about NBPGR. The FDP was concluded by the presentation of Dr. Ritu Gupta on "Virtual experiments of Botany". She emphasized the importance of virtual experiments in the present pandemic situation where studies are going online. She gave a demonstration of various virtual experiments like mitosis, plasmolysis, osmosis, and paper chromatography.

An online talk was organised by the Department on 16 September, 2021 on the occasion of World Ozone Day. Ms. Prasphutita

Nanda, Scientific Officer, Rajasthan State Pollution Control Board delivered the talk on the topic "Introduction to Earth's Sunscreen the Ozone Layer". Seventy-one students attended the talk.

To instill deep knowledge and boost confidence in the students, online PowerPoint presentations were organised on 27 September, 2021. The students of B. Sc. Part II gave presentations on the



topics of their syllabus like DNA structure, gel electrophoresis, plant hormones, Calvin cycle, etc. one hundred and sixty students gave the presentations.

Identification of plants is important for the successful conservation of plant resources and their sustainable use. To inculcate interest in this field, a plant identification quiz was conducted for PG students and UG students on 27 October, 2021 and 26 November, 2021 respectively. One hundred and fifty-three students attempted the quiz.

On 3 December, 2021 thirty-six students of M.Sc. Sem-II gave offline PowerPoint presentations on various topics of their curriculum like chromosomal mapping, leaf growth, and differentiation, cot curves, and preparation of herbarium, etc. This helped the students to get a deep insight into the subject as well as enhanced their presentation skills.

A one-day workshop was organised by the Department of Botany on "Tray Garden" for the B.Sc. students on 4 December, 2021. Sixty students participated in the workshop. The resource person of the session was Ms. Anshul Avasthi, a young entrepreneur, who is a Yoga trainer and Founder of Anaya Creations. She explained how a beautiful tray garden can be made even by basic things present in the home. She emphasized the selection of plants like Jade, Pothos, Sansevieria, Syngonium for the Tray garden. She also demonstrated the methods of decorating the tray garden with miniatures of Buddha, mushrooms, humans, fences, and coloured stones. The students enthusiastically participated in the workshop and showed keen interest in the art of tray gardens.

An extension lecture was conducted on "Elements of Scientific writing- some Do's and Don'ts" by Dr. Deepak Kumar Gupta, Consultant Statistician, and Chief Analyst, C DART on 28 January, 2022 which was attended by one hundred and seventeen students. He emphasized key points which must be considered while writing a research paper and selecting a journal for publication.

#### DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

The year 2021 brought a whole new perspective to learning and teaching not only for students but for faculty members as well. The Department of Business Administration left no stone unturned by organizing various activities, interactive sessions, and webinars both online as well as offline to keep the students adept, engaged, and holistically developed. This year the session began with a departmental FDP of ten days, from 8 - 20 July, 2021 where sessions were conducted by the external guests as well as by the departmental faculties. The main aim of the FDP was to update faculty members with innovations and learnings in research and teaching. The department in collaboration with MSME Development Institute, Ministry of MSME, GOI organised a two-day webinar on 22 - 23 July, 2021 about Industrial Motivation where students were motivated for their own startups, and basic training for the same was given. A total of thirty students attended this webinar via Cisco WebEx. On 26 August, 2021, a Business Quiz was organised virtually for students of B. Com on the basic concepts and current affairs of the business world. A total of eighty-seven students participated in this quiz.

Moving further, a webinar on "Research and Innovation in Business Management" by Dr. Narendra Singh Bhati, Associate Professor, Manipal University, Jaipur was organised by the department on 28 August, 2021 via MS Teams. He emphasized the idea of innovation in selling and providing services in the new era of post covid. Thirty-five students attended the session. An online session on "Campus to Corporate" was conducted for students by Ms. Apoorva Nagpal, Chief Branding and Marketing officer, ZUCOL on 25 September, 2021 in which forty-six students participated. She focused on the skills required to get a job in the corporate world right after graduation. On 23 October, 2021, an online Career Assessment Test was organised in collaboration with Global University Systems, to help students understand better career opportunities. Around forty-three students participated in the test.



Further, on 24 November, 2021 an extension lecture was held on the topic "Ethics in advertising by Professor Pradeep Sharma, HOD Department of Business Administration in Rajasthan University, Jaipur. Around seventy-two students attended the lecture in the classroom and resolved their queries related to sales and advertising. On 26-27 November, 2021 a workshop on communication skills was organised for the students to help them learn about practical aspects of corporate communication in both oral and written form. The workshop was conducted by the BBA Alumni, Ms. Mariya Bakshi and ninety-one students attended the workshop. Further, a webinar on "Digital Marketing- Useful Tools and Techniques" was

conducted on 4 December, 2021 in collaboration with ITM Institute in which one hundred and fifty-four students were registered. Dr. Kalpana Kumaran, HOD, Department of Digital Marketing and Transformation took the session and focused on relevance and new scope in the field of digital marketing. On 7 December, 2021 a session on "Think without Ink" was conducted in association with IMS Institute Jaipur to enable students to learn more about prospective career opportunities. They guided and motivated students for mathematical and aptitude tests. Seventy-three students enrolled for this session. On 17 January, 2022 a webinar on "Future of Management" was conducted by Professor Ravi Miglani, from Ahmedabad University, where around hundred students attended the session and gained insight into new areas of business and management. Lastly, an online extension lecture on the topic "How to write a Book Review" was taken by Dr. Tapasya Julka Mehrotra PDF Department of Business Administration UOR on 29 January, 2022 for the students in which students learned about the importance and the correct way of writing a book review in detail.

### **DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY**

Chemistry is an incredibly fascinating subject because it is so fundamental to our world that it touches almost every aspect of our existence. In order to provide a better insight of the subject, apart from online teaching, many activities were organised by the Department of Chemistry throughout the academic session 2021-22.

The session started with a ten day departmental Faculty Development Programme (FDP) from 9 - 22 July, 2021. Dr. Neeru Razdan, Head of the Department inaugurated the event with her words of wisdom. Dr. Arti Mishra discussed on 'Every Aspect of Stress Management in Our Day-to-Day Lives'. Dr. Pragati Natani elaborated on 'Introduction to Statistics'. Dr. Naveen Sharma from University of Rajasthan spoke on 'Leadership Building and Communication Skills'. Ms. Nisha Saini threw light on the use of a software -'ChemSketch' and Dr.



Nidhi Gupta discussed about 'Blended Learning'. Dr. Nidhi Agnihotri discussed 'Nanotechnology and Applications of Graphene'. Dr. Ranjana Agrawal spoke on 'Choosing an Appropriate Journal for Article Publication and Journal Metrics'. Dr. Kumud Tanwar explained the topic 'Writing in LaTex'. Dr. Sheetabh Sharma from the Department of Hindi discussed on 'Common Errors Made while Writing and Speaking Hindi Language'. Dr. Charu Goyal, Dr. Swatti Dhanwni and Dr. Preeti Sharma elucidated on 'Voice and Accent'. Ms. Priyanka Jangid spoke on Importance of Research Ethics'.

During this academic session, two seminars were conducted separately for the students of M.Sc. from 12 April to 10 May, 2021 and from 16 November to 6 December, 2021. The students gave online presentations on their topics based on curriculum. R.C. Mehrotra Memorial Lecture series was organised in hybrid mode by the Department of Chemistry, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur on 27 July and on 5 October, 2021. Twenty five Post-Graduate students of the department participated in this. The resource person Prof. Sanjay Mathur shared his knowledge on 'Metal Alkoxides as enablers for Academic Career and Innovative Materials'. Prof. Ashutosh Sharma spoke on 'Challenges, Opportunities and Directions of S&T in the New Millennium'.

On 9 October, 2021, a webinar on 'Nutrition for Healthy Living' was organised by the department with a well-known Nutritionist Dr. Medhavi Gautam as the resource person. She talked about the changing lifestyle and its adverse effects on a student's life. She also gave useful tips on maintaining better health and lifestyle during this pandemic situation. A total of nineteen students from Under-Graduate and Post-Graduate courses participated in the session.

'National Chemistry Week' was organised by the department in association with American Chemical Society from 20 - 22 October, 2021. This event was planned and executed by Post-Graduate students under the supervision of the faculty members. An active participation of around one hundred and sixty students was recorded in various competitions conducted. The winners of various competitions were Bharti Kumari and Rakhi–I position in Rangoli, Pooja Kalra- I position in Short Reels, Sana Charan and Palak Sharma –I position in Poster Making, Mahhum Hussain –I position in Model

& Fashion Show, Manisha Burdak and her team in Quiz, Tanishka Kanwar–I position in Slogan, Muskan Jain and Kirti Singh-I position in Live seminar, Kirti Singh–I position in Just a Minute.

Under the campaign 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav', a few webinars were conducted. Webinar on 'Career Prospects in Chemistry' was organised by BARC which was chaired by Dr. D.K. Awasthi (UPES, Dehradun) on 23 November, 2021. The resource person was Dr. A.K. Tyagi (BARC, HBNI). Dr. Kumud Tanwar participated in the 'Faculty Exchange Programme' on 16 December, 2021. organised by Maheshwari Girls P.G. College, Jaipur. The department conducted a workshop on 'Intellectual Property Rights Awareness Programme' under National Intellectual Property Awareness Mission (NIPAM) with Dr. Jitender Sharma as the resource person on 22 December, 2021. Around forty students of M.Sc. participated.

Many peer learning activities were organised throughout the session by the Post-Graduate students, catering to various scientific approaches. On 2 October, 2021 Ms. Aastha Arya discussed on 'The Use of LaTex'. On 29 January, 2022, Ms. Muskan Jain and Ms. Anuradha Sharma discussed on 'How to Write a Review Article' and 'The Importance of Internships and Fellowship Programmes' respectively. Around fifty students participated in these activities.

A certificate course on 'Photoelectron Spectroscopy Techniques for Material Science' was conducted by MNLT Jaipur in collaboration with GIAN from 31 January to 4 February, 2022. Ten Post-Graduate students of the department actively participated and gained knowledge from the expertise of Dr. Martin Kormunda (Purkyne University, Czech Republic).

The main objective of all these events organised through out the year was to provide a platform to both Under-Graduate and Post-Graduate students to explore, express, experiment and learn about the various aspects of the subject.

#### DEPARTMENT OF COMPUTER SCIENCE

She also discussed how these labs provide remote access to various labs and are available to everyone with no need of exclusive setup and equipments. When women take care of their health, they become their own best friend. A virtual session on 'Feminine Hygiene' was held on 22 October, 2021. About fifty-two students attended the session. Mrs. Pramila Poddar, stressed on the importance of health care and maintaining hygiene in daily lives of women, especially during the menstruation. She explained about the problems which girls face during this time. She also gave some tips to lead a healthy and hygienic lifestyle.

A person's attitude towards his work speaks for itself. On 8 December, 2021, a physical training session on the topic 'Soft Skills' was organised. Mr. Shiv Kumar, IT Trainer from Poddar Group of Institution, discussed about the basics of soft skills i.e Attitude, Body Language and Communication (ABC). He discussed the fear a student faces during the interviews and recruitment. He talked about a student's all round development, their attitude and behavioural aspects towards their work. He also discussed about how an individual becomes more effective by setting small goals and motivating themselves in the process of achieving their goals. Fifty-five students participated in the webinar. With this, the department of Computer Science successfully conducted various events and recorded active participation in the academic year 2021-22.

#### DEPARTMENT OF DRAWING AND PAINTING

The new academic session of 2021-2022 saw rekindling of hope with the abating of the devasting second wave of the COVID-19 pandemic. Despite the setbacks and hardships wrecked by the resurgence of the pandemic's severity, the students and

faculty members of the Department of Drawing and Painting sought to pursue their aspirations and goals.

A "CSR activity" was conducted in association with the NGO—Mother Earth Project—in the months of August and September, 2021. The students reveled themselves into preparing exceptional art works on five full-size parachutes on themes relating to environmental degradation and the climate crisis. In such, one parachute focused on deforestation, depicted animals calling upon and urging the mankind to stop cutting down trees, in an attempt to safeguard their lives while another parachute explored the theme of water pollution with special focus on the issue of oil spillage and its impact on aquatic life. The third



parachute worked on the topic of renewable energy, encouraging a shift from environmentally degrading energy sources to the use of solar panels and windmills for producing clean energy whereas the fourth one addressed the disastrous effects and consequences of climate change with reference to the melting of glaciers and rising of sea levels resulting in the flooding of towns and cities on one hand, and the resultant droughts on the other. The final parachute approached the theme by centering India, marked by an urgency to save the earth and its environment through an illustration of striking appeals and slogans. This activity was conducted under the guidance of Dr. Sarika Kaul, Ms. Preeti Kaushal and Ms. Ritika Kumari from the 31 August to 23 September, 2021 and saw the participation of nineteen students showcasing their creative

talent in the form of impressive and thought-provoking artworks. With the artworks painted in 3D technique, the activity helped in not only enhancing creative thinking, drafting skills, visualizing techniques focusing on specific themes but also in sharpening skills relating to handling of acrylic medium and painting skills.

To commemorate the International Day of Peace, a display and presentation of the parachute artworks designed by the students of the department was organised by the Mother Earth Project NGO at Jawahar Circle on 24 September, 2021. Alongside the Principal, Dr. Seema Agrawal, the faculty members: Dr. Sarika Kaul, Ms. Preeti Kaushal, Ms. Ritika Kumari and nineteen students emphasized and made an appeal to uproot the destructive underlying system of



Climate Change, in order to save the environment, they also emphasized to reaffirm and uphold the belief in the United Nations goals on Sustainable Development (SDGs). # DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC ADMINISTRATION AND FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

## **DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS**

The Department of Economics organised a plantation drive activity 'Plantation: Taking a Green Step Forward' on 14 July, 2021. The aim of the session was to give clarity to students and help them make the right career choice. The speakers of the session Dr Thakur Dev Pandey and Dr Oum Kumari of Manipal University enlightened the students the traditional career choices as well the

new career options in the field of Economics. The session was attended by eighty-one students. The session helped the students to gain an immense understanding of the way ahead with Economics.

The changed scenario after the pandemic has affected all spheres of life and has serious implications for the digital divide. The digital divide describes the discrepancy between people who have access to the resources to use new information and communication tools such as the Internet and people who do not have the resources and access to the technology. The term also describes the discrepancy between those who have the skills,



knowledge and abilities to use the technologies and those who do not. An Essay Writing Competition was held on the topic 'Digital Divide in the Era of the Pandemic' on 1 October, 2021. Forty-two students expressed themselves with an explanation of the term and supported their arguments with relevant data. Winners were awarded E-certificates.

The department organised a guest lecture on 'Agrarian Distress and the Way Forward' on 22 November, 2021. It was an honour and privilege for the department as Professor Vijay Vir Singh was the guest speaker who enlightened with his views on this current issue. 
# The Chronicles





#### **DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS**



## **DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY**

The Department of Psychology organised numerous interesting activities for students and faculty members during the academic year 2021-22. The first online session was organised jointly by the department and Centre for Counselling and Guidance of the college on the topic 'Mental Health for Educators' on 4 June, 2021. The guest speaker for the event was Dr. Dimpy Mahanta, Founder Head, Department of Psychology, Cotton University (Member, IAHP Covid-19 National Task Force). The webinar was held to address the issue of mental health and the ways to deal with it. It was an attempt to spread awareness and answer questions related to mental wellbeing of individuals and ways and methods to overcome the difficulties which individuals face in their daily lives. Almost seventy-five faculty members of the college from various departments were present in the webinar and found it very engaging and enlightening. Mental health is significant to overall health and wellbeing of an individual. Mental health is vital as it affects how we handle stress. It is also closely connected to, personal and emotional well-being.

On the occasion of 'World Suicide Prevention Day' (10 September) the department and Centre for Counselling and Guidance together organised a round table on 'Coping with Post-CovidWorld and Mental Health Issues' on 11 September, 2021. The experts for the event were Abhay Singhal (Entrepreneur, CEO at TickTalkTo, IIT Bombay graduate), Dr. Tarun Monga (Social Entrepreneur), Ms. Ritika Bhutani (Clinical Psychologist from Nimhans Bangalore) and Ms. Hemal Singhal (Social Activist). The virtual roundtable was conducted to discuss, address and spread awareness about mental health. The main topic of discussion was post-covid situations and how the pandemic has triggered an array of emotional, physical and social disturbances. Almost ninety-two present and former students were present in the round table discussion.

To observe World Mental Health Day on 10 October, 2021 the department organised workshop on 'Psychological First Aid' (PFA) which was one of the themes of the year 2021. The expert for the workshop was Ms Archita Pradhan (School

Psychologist, Ahmedabad). She introduced the term PFA and its importance. The purpose of PFA is to assess the immediate concerns and needs of an individual in the aftermath of a disaster, and not to provide on-site therapy. PFA is about comforting someone who is in distress and helping them feel safe and calm. The three action principles of Look, Listen and Link indicate that PFA is a way to approach someone in distress. Students also got chance to interact with the expert. More

than eighty-nine students participated in the webinar. On the same day that is 11 October, 2021 movie show and analysis on 'Marnie' by Alfred Hitchcock a psychological thriller was done by Ms. Hemal Singhal (social analyst) to understand how past trauma affects individual personality and skills to cope with it.

On 25 November, 2021 the department celebrated the 'International Day for Elimination of Violence against Women' by showcasing documentaries 'The Suffragettes' and 'Domestic Violence in India' to draw the attention of students towards the plight of women, causes and consequences of violence against women in India. Violence against women continues to be an obstacle in achieving human rights, equality and peace. The department presented documentaries as a medium to enhance



the knowledge on a sensitive issue. Sixty-two students participated in this activity.

Department of Psychology also organised an offline lecture on 'Understanding the Self with Career Advancement' by Dr. Shubha Sharma, Principal of Maheshwari P.G. Girls College on 22 December, 2021 where she discussed the various aspects of understanding oneself along with the working environment. In a competitive working environment, being self-aware is very important to achieve what you wish. #### **DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY**

The Department of Sociology in the academic session 2021-22 focused on promoting overall development of the students by conducting various student centric activities. Moreover, the faculty members were also encouraged to learn from each other via virtual mode. The Department of Sociology along with the Department of Home Science and Psychology participated in a ten-day In-House Faculty Development Programme from 8-15 July, 2021 during which each faculty member shared their knowledge pertaining to topics relevant to each of the disciplines concerned.

The session began with the virtual launching of an annual skit, "Drishtikon" on 15 August, 2021 which was performed by the students of the Department. With an aim of highlighting socially relevant issues, this year the theme was titled, "Desh-E-Naqaab", which depicted the plight of students during Covid -19 Pandemic. This venture involved twenty-three students from BA Part III. This was followed by a guest lecture on "Examining the Anthropological Studies on Indian Society and Caste" by Dr. Neekee Chaturvedi, Associate Professor, Department of History, University of Rajasthan. The lecture was conducted virtually on 26 August, 2021, and fifty-eight students were made aware of the intricate details of the correlation between anthropological studies and the Indian caste system.

In order to motivate students and to make them realize the importance of positive thinking, the Department then organised another virtual guest lecture by Dr. Tanjul Saxena, Teaching and Training consultant on "The Spark Within: A Positive Approach to Life and Living", 25 September, 2021. Eighty-two students enthusiastically participated in this interactive session. Moreover, to create awareness among the students pertaining to malignancies which are prevalent among women, a virtual lecture titled "Malignancies among Women: Myths and Truths", was organised on 27 October, 2021. The resource person Dr. Nidhi Patni, Senior consultant and Coordinator at Bhagwan Mahaveer Cancer Hospital and Research Center, Jaipur clarified doubts and myths pertaining to cancer. Fifty-four students benefited from the lecture.

A three-day workshop on "Social Research and Statistics" was organised from 20-22 December, 2021 to provide conceptual clarity about the use of Statics in social research. Prof. (Retd) Amita Sharma from University of Rajasthan was the resource person and one hundred and sixty-two students participated in the workshop.

The department also organised a webinar on "Future Prospects and Management of Health care Industry in India" in collaboration with IIHMR, Delhi on 25 January, 2022. The purpose of the webinar was to make the students aware about the career opportunities available in the Healthcare sector. The students specifically belonging to the final year of the Under Graduate programme were part of the webinar. One hundred and forty-eight students from various streams participated in the webinar.

#### **DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY**

Department of Zoology took various academic initiatives throughout the year to create dynamic learning space for students and to excel the academic competence of the faculty members.

The process of faculty development enriches the efficiency of faculty for teaching, assessment, research and other

pertinent educational related roles. FDPs exposes faculties to new ideas and information that are inherently a part of academic development. Keeping the fact in mind that the efforts of faculty members become more effective in the classroom, eight days Faculty Development Program (FDP) was jointly organised by the Department of Biotechnology and Department of Zoology from 8-17 July, 2021. The programme was designed in such a way so as to give maximum exposure to the faculty members on various aspects of hands-on experience ranging from Tools and Techniques used in Biological Sciences for acquaintance with animal systems through dissection demonstrations.



On the occasion of World Elephant Day i.e., 12 August, a poster competition was organised on the theme 'Awareness, Protection and Conservation of Elephants'. It was an attempt to raise the voice for saving elephants by the participants. Three best posters were awarded from the total of thirteen entries received.

An online invited talk on the topic 'Endangered Wings' on the occasion of International Vulture Awareness Day i.e., 4 September by Dr. Vivek Sharma (Assistant Professor, RIE, Ajmer) was organised, fifty-two students attended the talk and interacted with the speaker.

It is very crucial to preserve wildlife and to contribute to this cause, the department celebrated Wildlife Week from 1-7

October, 2021. To celebrate the week, on 3 October, 2021 twenty-two students of M.Sc. (Sem. II) went for an educational trip to Bisalpur dam and fish aquarium. Wildlife awareness activities were also conducted during the celebration as on 4 October, 2021 'Express yourself' a chart/ model exhibition and 'Raise Your voice' an extempore on wildlife issues was organised for the students of B.Sc. Part I (twenty-two students) and B.Sc. Part II (fourteen students).

On 6 October, 2021, ninety-six students of B.Sc. Part III visited Nahargarh Biological Park with the aim to learn about the habitat of animals and to develop awareness of endangered species. The students explored the biological park and prepared a detailed report of the visit.



Department also observed World AIDS Day on 1 December, 2021 by organising a poster making competition on the theme 'AIDS Awareness and Prevention' for B.Sc. Part I in which twenty-three students participated and a PowerPoint presentation competition on "Current Scenario of AIDS' for B.Sc. Part II in which fourteen students participated. The students were awarded with first, second and third prize respectively.

Eleven students of M.Sc. (Semester I) visited a bird exhibition on 'Scavenger Bird', exhibited by Dr. Asha Sharma in Jawahar Kala Kendra on 4 December, 2021.

In a nutshell, diverse academic activities were conducted throughout the session contributing significantly in sharpening the knowledge, competency and ability of the students and also widened their horizon in the field of Zoology.
