Report of the National Seminar on
"Recreating Approaches to Pedagogy for Quality
Enhancement in Higher Education"
29th – 30th January, 2018

A two day National Seminar on "Recreating Approaches to Pedagogy for Quality Enhancement in Higher Education", was held on $29^{th} - 30^{th}$ January, 2018 with the support of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The seminar formally began with the lamp lighting and formal welcome of guests and dignitaries present in the Inaugural Session. While stating the objective of the seminar, Principal, Dr. Mini T.C stated that the changing technology has replaced traditional methods of teaching. Therefore, such academic exercises are required to device new Techno-Pedagogical Techniques and Strategies. While presenting the overview of the seminar, Dr. Seema Agarwal, Convenor, of the Seminar pointed out that economic progress is affected by the quality of higher education. There are emerging new challenges to the higher education like mushroom growth of low quality institutions, lack of research, problem of employability and so on. Since colleges are major stakeholders in the field of higher education, we must prepare to meet these challenges. The seminar aimed at making viable suggestions to NAAC in the light of these challenges.

Justice Panachand Jain, President, Kanoria Girls College Trust in his special address underlined the fact that quality education is a necessity in order to build the character of a student, and nation, both. Throwing light on the legal aspect, Justice Jain stated that the Supreme Court has treated the Right to Education as a Fundamental Right, making it a state responsibility towards citizens. Since private institutions do not receive any help from the government, they must be kept out of the state purview, so that the quality of education does not suffer.
















The Chief Guest, **Prof. M.C. Sharma**, Vice-Chairman, Rajasthan State Council of Higher Education made use of statistics to impress upon the quantitative superiority of Indian Higher Education System in global terms. But he expressed his concern regarding the qualitative aspect as the Indian Higher Education fails to meet the global standards. He believed that several factors were responsible for it, like indifference to classes among students, decline in the teacher-taught relationship, mushroom growth of coaching centre, lack of research aptitudes and so on. He held that addressing these issues along with the qualitative development of teachers was the need of the hour.

In his keynote address **Prof. B.P. Sharma**, President, Pacific University, Udaipur, emphasised that the dismal state of higher education in India is due to teaching of outdated theories and non-updation of concept. He suggested alternative and new approaches to education like Andragogy, Heutagogy, Peeragogy, Fish Bowl Technique to name a few.

The Director of the college, Dr. Rashmi Chaturvedi in her Presidential Address, opined that globalisation was an opportunity to reform our education system, but we have missed the bus. By using innovative technologies in teaching improving mental abilities and refining skills we can match up to the global standards. Vote of thanks was delivered by Dr.Deeptima Shukla, Dean Academics of the college and the organizing Secretary of the Seminar.

The first Plenary followed by Technical session was chaired by **Prof. Ravindra Vinayak**, Director Delhi School of Professional Studies and Research, GSS Indraprasth University, New Delhi. Prof. Vinayak made the point of mismatch between the requirement of industries and products of educational institutions. In the wake of parents' indifference in sending their ward to class and growth of coaching centres, the challenge of bringing the students to class can be met by making the education learner-centric or student centric.

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Dr. Vinod Bhardwaj, Associate Professor (Geography), Department of College Education, Government of Rajasthan, stressed that to meet the market needs, it is required to make education productive by focusing on Quality, Delivery Facility and Employability. He also threw light on various skill development programmes being run by the Rajasthan Government.

Dr. Anoop Srivastava, Principal, R.R. Autonomous College, Alwar, negated the concept of employability as a parameter or responsibility of the higher education, rather it is the result of higher education. He said that Teachers', Institutional and Students' Assessment are the real standards of quality education. Ms. Priyanka Sharma, presented a research paper entitled "Role of Higher Education in Employability".


In the Workshop on "Indianizing Research", Prof.S.K. Agarwal, Professor and Head, Department of English, Maharaja Ganga Singh University, Bikaner, accentuated the need of reviving higher education on the lives of ancient Indian culture. He focussed on research as improvisation of ideas and mentioned that it should integrate both the industry and the Curriculum.

Prof. Joya Chakravarty, Professor, Department of English, University of Rajasthan in her Presidential Remarks, advocated the pursuance of research as a passion. She emphasized upon the social relevance of research and revisiting the ancient Indian Traditions of Research.

In the First Panel Discussion on "Assessment, Evaluation and Examination Reforms", **Prof. B.L. Gupta**, Former Controller of Examination, University of Rajasthan, stated that nowadays the priority of students has changed from education to marks. According to him, quality of result should be assessed and the multiplicity of papers should be avoided.











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Ms. Sweta Bansal, student of M.Com (ABST) shared her concern over Brain-Drain which was largely due to lack of enthusiasm among students for degree course, which are not employment oriented. This problem can be solved by inculcating practical knowledge and internships in the curriculum.

Prof. V.K. Gupta, Controller of Examination, University of Rajasthan discussed the role of RTI in exams and evaluation system. He stressed upon present assessment and evaluation system.

Chair of the Session, Prof. D.N. Sansanwal, Former Director and Dean, Institutie of Education, Devi Ahilya University, Indore, dealt with various issues in question paper setting. Prof. Sansanwal also explained the alternative assessment systems devised by him through his presentation.

The second day (30th January, 2018) began with the second plenary session on "Role of Institutions and Stakeholder on Overall Growth of Higher Education". **Prof. Harsh Purohit**, Dean of FMS-WISDOM of Banasthali University in his presidential remarks compared the prevalent education to the ancient Indian educational system and made a strong point in favour of adopting Indian Culture to do away with the lacunae of the present system. The present dismal state of education is because of VULA-Volatility, Uncertainty, complexity and Ambiguity. To overcome a holistic and integrated approach to education is required promoting strong character, sound physique, creative and national approach and problem solving skills.

Dr. Rashmi Jain, Vice-Principal, University Maharani's College favoured the numerical growth of higher education institutions to meet the needs of growing population. She dealt with the massification of education by focussing on the following points: Regulators, Lack of knowledge, Financial Problems, Student Orientations, Role of Teachers and Low Enrolment Ratios.

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The other resource person, **Dr.Garima Malik** from the National University of Educational Planning and Administration, explored the industry academics collaboration along the lives of expansion and massification, diversification in courses, mode of delivery, growth of private sector, affiliating structures, more support for professional development, interference in leadership appointment, faculty shortages and so on. She also discussed new developments like HEERA, HEFA and SWAYAM.

In the second Technical Session on "Compatibility of Higher Education – Harmony with Employability, Skill Development, Market Requirements and Global Demand", Chairperson, **Dr.Sudhir Singh** made a strong statement against the favoritism, nepotism and corruption in higher education management. He opined that a transparent appointment process will ensure quality of higher education.

Dr. Bharti Mishra while discussing the problems of employability, communication skills, versatility, alliances etc. stressed on adopting values and ethics in higher education to meet these challenges.

Col. S.M. Bhardwaj pressed the need for developing soft skills in basic education to fill the gap between degree and knowledge and industry requirements and higher education.

There were three paper presentations in this session:

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In the Second Panel Discussion, Chairperson, Prof. P.C. Trivedi, Former Vice-Chancellor of Deen Dayal Upadhyay University, Gorakhpur, compared education with flower having five petals — Teachers, Students, Quality of Teaching, Management/Leadership and Government. The quality of education is ensured when all the five petals function properly.

Prof. K.K. Gautam, former Senior Regional Director, Indira Gandhi National Open University discussed four pillars of education learning to know, learning to do, learning to be and learning to live together. He urged that the teachers should transform their roles form 'Knowledge Giver' to 'Knowledge Facilitator'.

Prof. Kshama Agarwal, Former Director of PG School of Commerce, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur opined that education is a two way process of merging the identities of the teacher and the students. She stressed the need of convergent and divergent thinking simultaneously, to better the quality of higher education.

Student Panelist, Ms. Priyanka Sharma (M.A. English) discussed in detail her observations of the present education system, the challenges faced by students and possible solutions.

The seminar concluded with the formal valedictory session, wherein the organizing Secretary Dr.Seema Agarwal delivered the welcome address followed by the presentation of seminar report by Chief Rapporteur, Dr. Palu Joshi.

Chief Guest, Ms. Gurjot Kaur, Director General, HCM RIPA, Jaipur expressed her concern over the issue of employability and emphasised the need of skill development. According to Ms. Kaur, higher education must prepare the youth to meet the national and social problems if India wishes to outwit China in development.

Guest of Honour, **Dr. Sudhir Verma**, Director Shiv Charan Mathur Social Policy Research Institute, Jaipur advocated the training of college teachers in pedagogy, so that they can attract students to classes. Also a good education policy for higher education is the need of the hour.

Principal, Dr. Mini T.C. in her concluding remarks, shared her observations of the two day academic discourse, which included; value based education, commitment of faculty members, passion for teaching and learning in teacher, more research, industry academia interface, skill development, attracting student to classes, more skill based training for post graduate level students and focus on learning through research.

The Director of the College, **Dr. Rashmi Chaturvedi**, said that focus should be more on what should be done. A teacher is absolutely autonomous in his/her class and is free to adopt any strategy/approach to involve the student in the learning process. She urged the teachers and the taught to, "Awake, Arise and Shine". Lastly, Dr.Sarla Sharma, Dean Student Welfare and Co-convenor of the seminar delivered a formal Vote of Thanks.

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




Following recommendations emerged from the two day discussions and presentations:

- 1. New techno-pedagogical technologies and strategies need to be devised.
- 2. New approaches like Andragogy, Heutagogy, Peeragogy and Fish Bowl Technique should be practiced in class.
- 3. Higher education needs to aim at building the character of the students and nation both
- 4. Teacher -Taught relationship needs to be amicable and the ratio should be moderate.
- 5. The testing module for the student should be as per the stream.
- 6. There should be amalgamative approach for higher studies for the students.
- 7. Examination pattern should be varied and practical oriented.
- 8. Education should be more Democratic and more Decentralized.
- 9. Autonomy is a must in order to assess the accountability of the teachers and the students.
- 10. The Primary need is to reform examination pattern that would decide classroom methodology.
- 11. The challenge of bringing the students to class can be met by making the education learner-centric/student centric.
- 12. Research should integrate both the industry and the Curriculum and also emphasis upon the social relevance.
- 13. Education must prepare the youth to meet the national and social problems so that India attains International recognition.
- 14. Soft Skills need to be incorporated in basic education to fill the gap between degree and knowledge.
- 15. Education should aim at enhancing skill sets of the students so that they become employable.




