# **Report of the Workshop on Remote Sensing on Geographic Information System**

With rapidly growing possibilities, the discipline of remote sensing and GIS has recently become attractive and exciting. Numerous organisations invest a lot of money in these areas. Here, the issue of why these areas have become so significant in recent years arises. There are two basic causes for this. 1) Scientists, researchers, students, and even the general public nowadays are very interested in gaining a deeper knowledge of the environment. By environment, we refer to the physical surroundings of their study area as well as the activities that take place there. In other words, we have realised that physical space and the information that describes it are a part of our daily lives and that practically every choice we make is impacted or determined by some aspect of geography. 2) Improvements in complex space technologies (which can give enormous amounts of geographical data), together with falling prices for computer hardware and software (which can manage these data), have made remote sensing and geographic information systems (G.I.S.) accessible to an ever-larger range of users.

The Department of Geography at Kanoria PG Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Jaipur recognised the need for instruction in these fields and on September 28, 20s19, hosted a workshop on remote sensing on geographic information systems in collaboration with the Jaipur chapter of the Indian Society of Geomatics (ISG). The purpose of this course was to impart knowledge and raise awareness about the principles of both remote sensing and GIS. 65 students who are enrolled in graduate and post-graduate geography programmes attended the session. Prof. P.M. Udani, Chairman, ISG and President, VGU Jaipur, Er. K.K. Mishra, Secretary, ISG, Er. Rajesh Kumar Chauhan, Treasurer, and Mr. Subhash Chandra Sharma, Senior Town Planner, led the workshop session.
