

Technical session I



The first technical session was devoted to "Introduction to Intellectual Property Rights". Mr. Govind Sharma, Ex Chief National Research Development Corporation, New Delhi presided as the chairperson. Mr.

N.C. Jain, Principal Chief Conservator of Forests was the key note speaker and Shri Pankaj Kumar, IPR Facilitator, IIS University was the expert speaker for the session. The Speakers justified the objective of the session as they highlighted all the known and unknown facts of the topic.



Mr. Govind Sharma through his words of wisdom on Intellectual Property Rights enlightened the dignitaries. He gave a detailed overview of the topic, enriched the audience with the constitutional provisions related to IPR, patent Acts various categories of IPR and ways to strengthen IPR, referred to the examples from social and economic aspects of life. "Intellectual Property is the oil of 21st century" was a thought provoking concluding statement.

Mr. N C Jain spoke on the topic Bio-Diversity Conservation: Traditional Knowledge and Implications. Here in he talked about factors responsible for biodiversity variations conservation problems and impact of modernization. The most influencing part of his lecture was the connection of traditional knowledge with the contemporary world, he also enriched the audience with the Religious and Medicinal value of plants. He ended with a statement "We will lose our planet if we do not conserve it".



Shri Pankaj Kumar speaking on the topic shared a practical aspect of Intellectual property rights. He considered intellectual property as the property of mind, for which a balance has to be maintained so that inventor is at win situation, Recognition is a

source of motivation and hence it is important, he focused on the need to acquire benefit out of our intellectual property. Mr. Kumar, while concluding his speech, remarked that "A Mind Power can Change your life so value it."



Ms. Diksha Sharma presented her paper titled "Patent license agreement and cartelization". She spoke about market structure connecting it to intellectual rights effects on market and how consumers are affected by it.

The session provided a great learning to the participants and it was extremely stimulating.




Technical Session II and III



The second and third technical session entitled "Protection of Traditional knowledge and IPR and Biological Resources Interface." was chaired by **Prof. Ashwani**

Kumar Sharma, Former Head,
Department of Botany, University
of Rajasthan, Jaipur. He discussed
in detail about the traditional
medicines and biodiversity
conservation. His speech was highly
informative in relation to medicinal
value of plants around us. He also




shared his experiences while he was working in Japan at medical college and with WHO. He also talked about the deadly diseases like HIV, Cancer, Tuberculosis etc. can be treated by plants. Mr. Sharma dedicated his



lecture to Amrita Devi and 363 tree lovers and concluded his speech talking about the value and importance of holy tulsi plant which is easily available in our homes.

Mr. Pankaj Kumar Gupta, Advocate, Rajasthan High Court, spoke about the legal Aspect of IPR. He focused on Trademark and why they are needed. He also raised few questions related to Copyright Act and Trademark, which helped the audience to understand the difference between the two in a better way. He also highlighted on the Startup plan in India and laid emphasis on the various Action Plans of the Government.



Dr G.V. Reddy, Head of the Forest Force and Chairman, Rajasthan State Biodiversity Board, Government of Rajasthan shared his views on Access Benefit sharing, the relationship between ABS and IPR, benefit to community,

Nagoya protocol and Biodiversity Act 2002, were other few issues which were raised by Dr. Reddy in his address.





Or. Gunjan Sharma from Department of Science and Technology, Government of Rajasthan gave an explanatory talk on innovative cycle. She discussed in detail about IPR and Biotechnology. She touched all aspects related to Patent Goods. She also cited examples from India and abroad related to

Patent products and narrated some patent laws.

Dr. Deeptima Shukla, Vice-Principal presented the paper titled "Protection of traditional knowledge in ancient scriptures."



The objective of the session was very well achieved through the interactive discussion by the participants, and through queries satisfied by the experts.

Technical Session IV

The Technical Session IV on 'Biopiracy, Bioprospecting and Access Benefit Sharing Mechanism' on 18th January, 2020 was chaired by Dr. Vartika Arora, Principal, Rajasthan School of Law College for Women, Jaipur. The first speaker of the session Dr. Meenakshi Punia, Assistant Professor, Sardar Patel University of Police Security and Criminal Justice, Jodhpur presented her views on 'Biopiracy and Traditional Knowledge'. Her lecture was based on biopiracy and IPR related issues. She also highlighted that Monsanto, got our Indian melon,



sunflower, turmeric and brinjal patented by biopiracy. Madam also discussed the importance of traditional knowledge and the rich biodiversity which in present scenario is being exploited by the developed nations by

patenting. She quoted various examples of exploitation- The 'Jeevani of Kani Tribe', 'Kamu-Kamu' of Amazonia. She also illustrated various laws relating to bio- resource conservation like The Biological Diversity Act, 2002, TRIP, Patent Amendment Act, 2005, Convention on Biological Diversity and Nagoya Protocol.



The second speaker of the session, Dr. Abhishek Kumar Tiwari, Deputy Director, Five Year Law College, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur expressed his views on 'Bioprospecting, Biopiracy and



Access Benefit Sharing'. He said that bioprospecting can be regarded as an attack on the indigenous knowledge of the native people which is now getting commercialized and utilized for the profit of some industries. He also illustrated the example of Hoodia (a Cactus) of Hoodia community being exploited and patented by developed countries and Monsanto Genetic Use Restriction Technology. He then highlighted the importance of CBD in biodiversity protection, its sustainable utilization and access benefit sharing along with the description of various penalties levied on illegal trader. He said that to prevent biopiracy, we need to create awareness along with sustainable economy. Strict measures need to be taken against those who exploit our biodiversity. India and many such developing nations are mega biodiversity hotspots which need to be protected and conserved. Papers were presented by Ms. Vandita Srivastava, Research Scholar, Centre for Converging Technology, University of Rajasthan on 'Enabling the community through IPR Awareness' and by Dr. Sheetabh Sharma, Assistant Professor, Kanoria PG Mahila Mahavidyalaya, Jaipur on "Bhartiya Paramparik Sampada aur Aadhyatama".

Institute (TERI), New Delhi. He spoke on 'Policy and Regulatory Framework for biodiversity conservation in India'. He explained the constitutional aspect, National Forest Policy, 1988, Wildlife Protection Act, 1972, Indian Forest Act, 1927, Aichi and National Biodiversity

Target and International Conventions- UNFCCC, UNFF and the relevance with Access Benefit Sharing. He also said the conservation and management of resources, climate change mitigation, share authority and capacity building are various achievements way forward.

The first speaker of Technical Session V, **Dr. Harlal Singh Mali, Associate Professor, MNIT, Jaipur** enlightened with his words on 'IPR – Role of Biodiversity related Laws'. He illustrated various aspects of IPR – meaning of IPR, need to patent and legal issues related to it. He explained that IPR comprises of Patents, Trade Marks, Designs, Geographical Indicators (GI) and Copyright. He explained in detail about patents, their validity, and certification by case studies on dialysis of kidneys, Sketchers, GMOs and his own patent on visco-elastic grinding wheel. He further explained that for any product to get patented, it should be novel, innovative and of industrial utility. He concluded his speech by explaining various Biological Diversity related Laws for bio-resource conservation, Cartagena Protocol and Nagoya Protocol.



Dr. Komal Audichya, Jaipur National University, Jaipur expressed her views on 'Biological Diversity Act — Kani Tribe'. She explained biodiversity and its importance and said that India is the 17th mega biodiversity hotspot and has about 7 % of world species. In Western Ghats, a Kani-Tribe known to get lot of energy from fruit of 'Arogyapachak'. The researchers from TBGRI dwelled a project 'Jeevani' from the leaves of Aarogyapacha. In 1997, Kani tribal trust was registered and was given the royalty for 'Jeevani'. Despite of it, 'Jeevani' Trademark was patented by a US distributor. To resolve such cases, CBD emphasizes on access benefit sharing. Awareness needs to be created for long term plans of sustainable development. In this session, H. Kumar from CSTV, NGO, Alwar also



presented his views on "the Role of NGO in promotion of IPR and Biodiversity towards Climate Change & Energy Conservation for Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) through Community Development Centre."
