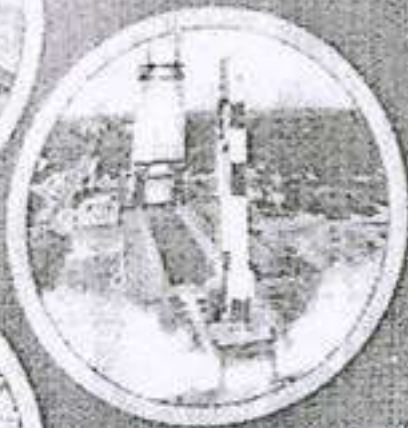

Development and Values : Indian Perspective

The term development logically signifies a process of change which is desirable and worthwhile. Questions regarding as to what is desirable and worthwhile cannot be decided purely on the factual basis. There has to be an evaluative criterion for the decision as to what would qualify as development. The term 'development', perhaps no one would disagree, is essentially evaluative and in most contexts it expresses a positive evaluation.¹ To talk of development is to compare. It could mean comparison of the two stages of a given entity at different moments of time, or of different but similar entities at the same moment of time. The term development is thus also comparative in character. A comparative judgment on quality further presupposes some identified or accepted positive direction of growth. Thus development means more and more an approximation towards an ideal or value through successive stages of change. The term 'development' has for very long remained attached with general materialist bias. This is evident with the factual basis on which countries until very recently have been characterised as developed, developing or underdeveloped. The principal criteria adopted for determining whether a nation is developed has been the quantity of goods produced or procured and consumed; the
