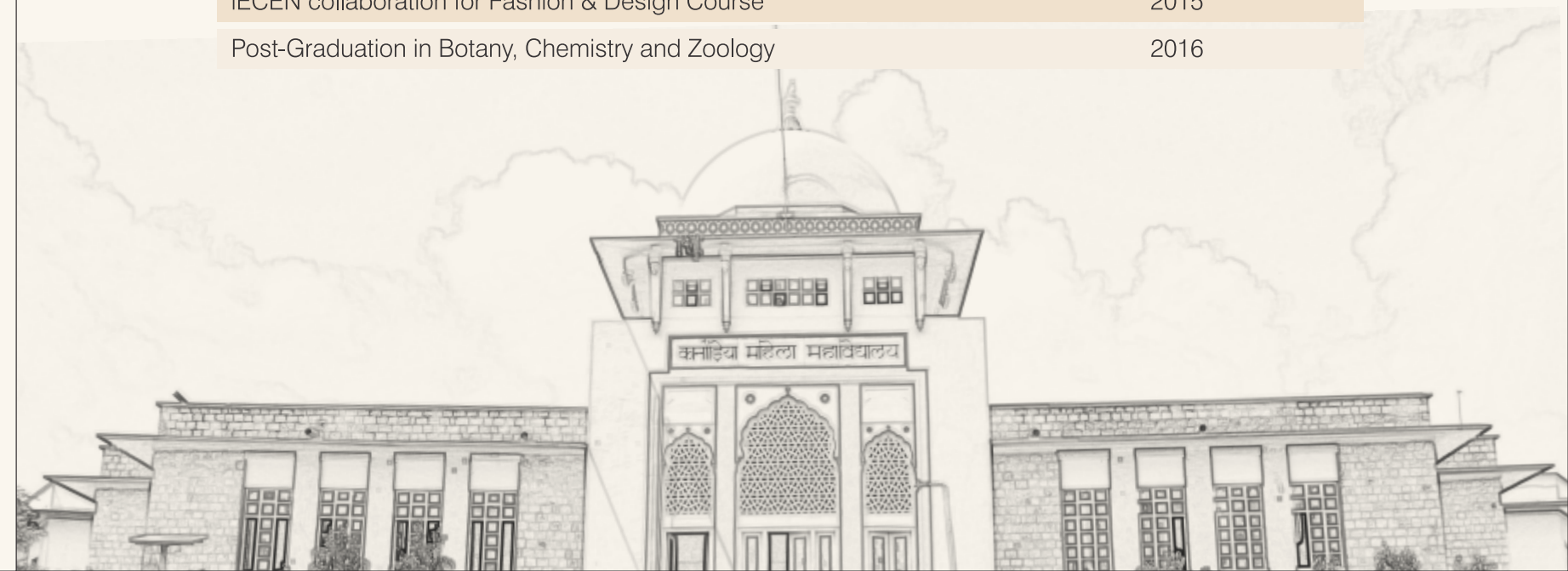

Admissions for New Students

- Admission lists will be posted on website and is updated from time to time. Kindly check the lists and pay the fees before the due date failing which your application shall not be considered under any condition.
- Admission to the desired/applied faculty and subject depends on the availability of seats.
- Kindly consult the Admission Committee for guidance in choosing subject combination and any queries related to admission.
- Provisional admission in Part-I to students with a supplementary in the Senior Secondary Examination is permissible.
- Students should enroll themselves in their respective subject classes within 15 days of paying their fees, failing which their admission will stand cancelled.
- If a student seeks change in faculty or subject, it will be permissible only on payment of Rs. 100/- and if seats are available in the desired faculty or subject. Faculty change is possible only from:
 - Science Faculty to Arts and Commerce.
 - Arts to Commerce.
 - Commerce to Arts.
- Inter transfer from one college to another college within the city is not allowed.

- Admissions to UG Part II and III and PG (Final Year) is also online.
- Students can apply for admission after the results have been declared and uploaded on the ERP.

Smart Classrooms

इस संस्था द्वारा किए जाने वाले प्रमुख कार्य निम्न हैं –

Subject Associations //

Commerce Association

It organizes interactive activities for students in order to further their interest in the discipline of commerce.

For this purpose the association conducts training of Data-entry, Tally, IT Return filling, SPSS, etc.; organizes talks, financial literacy workshops, group discussions, quiz and symposia; plans visits to bank, stock-exchange, account outstanding units, raw-material processing units etc.

Humanities Association

Self-exploration leads to self-improvement. Keeping in mind the differing perspectives of the global world, the association introduces various activities like screening of short films, group discussions and extension lectures. The forum helps the students inculcate a sensibility to explore the world of knowledge beyond books and curriculum.

IT Association

Computer literacy being an imperative requirement of students of any academic stream, the College has an “IT Association” intended to expose the students to software, hardware, internet and networking used in their daily activities.

The association provides opportunities to develop their presentation and technical skills in this competitive era. For this purpose the association conducts various activities and workshops for technical skills development, internet usage, power point presentation, technical quiz, workshops on uses of various apps in daily life and cyber security etc.

Management Association

It focuses on preparing the students for corporate world by developing their communication, employability and leadership skills. Interactive sessions with successful entrepreneurs, corporate leaders, industry visits, and foreign language courses supplement the learning process. Workshops on digital and social media marketing, biz quiz, sessions on meeting corporate expectations, PPT presentations, inter-collegiate competitions are organized regularly to build confidence and chisel the personality of future managers.

Science Association

It focuses on varied approaches to enhance awareness, inquisitiveness and application based learning to science amongst students. This association organizes power point presentations, poster and model making, seminar, quiz competitions and field trips to help students study the physical, chemical and biological aspects of non-natural and natural resources and diverse flora and fauna. It also prepares a platform for career talks and sessions to provide manifold career options in the field of science. The association organizes other programs to facilitate learning and creating interest in science.

Social Science Association

With the idea of promoting community awareness and welfare among the students, social science association provides its members a forum to discuss and analyze issues related to economics, political science, sociology, psychology, history and public administration. Organizations and experts are invited to enlighten the students on contemporary issues throughout the year. The association, on a regular basis organizes debates, movie shows, exhibitions, quizzes, field trips etc.

वाणिज्य समिति

मानविकी समिति

सूचना प्रौद्योगिकी समिति

प्रबंध समिति

Research Projects & Collaborations

On-Going Projects and Collaborations

The college is making concerted efforts to collaborate with Government Organizations, NGOs and premier institutions to inculcate in students critical abilities, a scientific temper and an analytic and reflective approach. Students can volunteer to associate with projects related to their subjects. The hands-on experience and experimental learning will blend academic and adventure elements into integrated learning - a unique opportunity for students to increase knowledge, develop skills and research aptitude.

Water Quality of Jaipur District

The college has collaborated with Greenth Envirotech to carry out student research project in the college on 'Water Quality of Jaipur District' in respect of hardness and fluoride content and its impact on Health with GIS. Students of geography under the guidance of their teacher will work on this project.

Soil Health Card Yojna

The college is an academic partner of the "Soil Health Card Yojna", a dream project of Honorable Prime Minister. It is funded by Central Government. The objective of this project is to analyse various soil parameters which will be beneficial for farmers and will be a step towards increasing the overall agriculture production. The project intends to encourage young scholars from life sciences towards research and development. It will contribute towards the implementation of government project for strengthening the economy as well as enhancing the skills and capacity building of the students.

Effect of Global Warming on domestic crops of Rajasthan

Research project entitled "Effect of Rising Temperature, Stress on Growth and Physiology of Domestic Crops of Rajasthan" funded by Rajsthan Rajya Utpadak Sahakari Sangh Limited-TILAM Sangh, is being carried out by the Department of Biotechnology in the college. Its objective is to identify the best responding crops in increasing heat stress (global warming) in terms of germination parameters as well as to identify the physiological and biochemical responses of crops under various temperature ranges without compromising with nutrient values.

Identification of bioactive compounds of selected medicinal plant species of Rajasthan

Rajasthan enjoys a rich biodiversity of plants because of its unique climate varying from arid to lush forests. Kanoria College continuing with its social responsibility, has taken a step to identify plants of medicinal properties used for centuries for therapeutic purpose and find their bioactive ingredients. A research project titled "Identification of bioactive compounds of selected medicinal plant species of Rajasthan" has been submitted to National Medicinal Plant Board, Ministry of Ayush. The project is under active consideration of the ministry.

Workshops

Grievance & Redressal Cell

The cell addresses problems, difficulties and complaints of the students. Students can drop their complaints, suggestions for improvements or problems faced in class/college/outside college in the 'Complaint Box' placed in front of the library and of the hostel. Remedial measures are taken without disclosing the identity of the student. Students facing ragging of any kind harassment in their personal lives or eve teasing and molestation can contact this cell. Confidentiality is assured.

Anti-Ragging Cell

Following the UGC Regulations, 2016 of "Curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions (Third amendment)", the college has established an Anti-Ragging Cell. Ragging constitutes any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background or any pretext whatsoever. Any fore-mentioned behaviour is strictly prohibited in the college campus.

Prevention of Sexual Harrassment of Women at Work Place

Our college has established an Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell. It makes students aware and employees of the recourse available to them regarding sexual harassment. It proactively moves to curb all forms of harassment of employees and students whether it is from those in a dominant power of hierarchical relationship or otherwise. Cell treats sexual harassment as a misconduct under service rules and initiates actions for misconduct.
