# Admission Procedure

## Admissions to all UG & PG Courses are online

### Admissions for New Students

- Admission lists will be posted on website and is updated from time to time. Kindly check the lists and pay the fees before the due date failing which your application shall not be considered under any condition.
- Admission to the desired/applied faculty and subject depends on the availability of seats.
- Kindly consult the Admission Committee for guidance in choosing subject combination and any queries related to admission.
- Provisional admission in Part-I to students with a supplementary in the Senior Secondary Examination is permissible.
- Students should enroll themselves in their respective subject classes within 15 days of paying their fees, failing which their admission will stand cancelled.
- If a student seeks change in faculty or subject, it will be permissible only on payment of Rs. 100/- only for a limited period and if seats are available in the desired faculty or subject. Faculty change is possible only from:
  - Science Faculty to Arts and Commerce.
  - Arts to Commerce.
  - Commerce to Arts.
- Inter transfer from one college to another college within the city is not allowed.
- For PG admissions contact respective Head of the Departments

### Policy for Fee Refund

Fee would be refunded subject to the following conditions

- If the application for the refund is received within 15 days of depositing the fees the refund would be 90% of the refundable amount.
  - If the application for refund is received within 30 days of depositing the fees the refund would be 50% of the refundable amount.
  - No fee will be refunded after 30 days of depositing the fees.
- Re-Admission for Current Students
- Admissions to UG Part II and III and PG (Final Year) is also online.
  - Students can apply for admission after the results have been declared and uploaded on the ERP.

- Participation in cultural activity at National Level will be given special weightage in admission.

Concession and Exemptions:

- Winners in National Level Sports will be given tuition fees (college fees) exemption after trials.
- Renewal of exemption will be subject to performance appraisal.
- Fee exemption between 50 to 100% will be given to national level achievers in sports, NSS, Scout and position holders from any board of examination.
- Fee concession will be given to meritorious students with 95% and above.

Quantum of concession will be decided by the college committee.

## SUBJECT ASSOCIATIONS

### वाणिज्य समिति

## Student Support Services

### Students Grievance & Redressal Cell

The cell addresses problems, difficulties and complaints of the students. Students can drop their complaints, suggestions for improvements or problems faced in class/college/outside college in the 'Complaint Box' placed in front of the library and of the hostel. Remedial measures are taken without disclosing the identity of the student. Students facing ragging of any kind, harassment in their personal lives or eve teasing and molestation can contact this cell. Confidentiality is assured.

### Anti-Ragging Cell

Following the UGC Regulations, 2016 of "Curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions (Third amendment), the college has established an Anti-Ragging Cell. Ragging constitutes any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background or any pretext whatsoever. Any fore-mentioned behaviour is strictly prohibited in the college campus.

### Prevention of Sexual Harrassment of Women at Work Place

The college has established an Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell. It makes students aware and employees of the recourse available to them regarding sexual harassment. It proactively moves to curb all forms of harassment of employees and students whether it is from those in a dominant power of hierarchical relationship or otherwise. Cell treats sexual harassment as a misconduct under service rules and initiates actions for misconduct.

विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग के नियमानुसार उच्च शिक्षण संस्थानों में रैगिंग को रोकने के लिए एंटी रैगिंग सैल का गठन किया जाना आवश्यक है। अतः हमारे महाविद्यालय में भी एंटी रैगिंग सैल की स्थापना की गई है। किसी विद्यार्थी द्वारा किसी अन्य विद्यार्थी को रंग, धर्म, जाति, लिंग, भाषा, स्थान, अर्थ अथवा अन्य किसी आधार पर शारीरिक या मानसिक रूप से प्रताड़ित करना 'रैगिंग' के अन्तर्गत आता है जो महाविद्यालय परिसर में पूर्णतः निषिद्ध है।

### कार्यस्थल पर यौन उत्पीड़न निवारण प्रकोष्ठ

यौन उत्पीड़न की रोकथाम के लिए इस प्रकोष्ठ की स्थापना की गई है। छात्राओं तथा कर्मचारियों को जागरूक करने के लिए इससे संबंधित जानकारी दी जाती है और यदि कोई प्रभावशाली व्यक्ति या उच्चाधिकारियों द्वारा भी उत्पीड़ित है तो भी त्वरित कार्यवाही की जाती है। कार्यस्थल पर यौन उत्पीड़न को सेवा नियमों की अवहेलना माना जाता है और उसके विरुद्ध कार्यवाही की जाती है।
